Local Law No 3 for the year 1996

A Local Law increasing the term of office of the Highway Superintendent from 2 years to 4 years.

Be It enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Fine as follows:

Section 1: Statutory Authority. This Local Law is adopted pursuant to the provisions of the Municipal Home Law of the State of New York.

Section 2: Increase in Term of Office. The term of office of the elected Town Highway Superintendent shall be four years. Such four year term shall apply to the person elected after January 1, 1997 provided a proposition submitted pursuant to Section 3 below is approved.

Section 3: Mandatory Referendum. This Local Law is adopted subject to a Mandatory Referendum and shall be submitted for approval of the qualified voters of the Town of Fine at the General Election to be held on November 5, 1996. A proposition in the following form shall be included in the ballot at such General Election and the increased term of office shall not take effect until after January 1, 1997 and only upon such proposition being approved by the majority vote of the qualified voters voting thereon.

Section 4: Supersession. This Local Law shall supersede Town Law Section 24 relating to the term of office for Town Highway Superintendent of the Town of Fine.

Section 5. This Local Law shall become effective upon January 1, 1997 upon being filed in the office of the Secretary of State after approval by the qualified voters.

(Final adoption by referendum.)
